



ONWARDS AND UPWARDS!

We now have four double sets of **adult gym equipment** that can give a full body workout: a Cross Rider, a Chest Press & Lat Pull, an Air Walker Duo, and a Skier. Eight people can work out at once. The range of equipment is suitable for all age groups (above four feet tall) and compatible with the free Caloo Pulse App, allowing you to track your progress (using a QR code).

The SUDS bond surfacing, on which the units are installed, allows for speedy drainage in winter, which means the site can be used all year round.

We secured a £6,500 grant from Heworth Without Ward to fund 50% of the cost of a set of **Yorkshire Stone Climbing Rocks**. Councillors from York City and Heworth Without Parish are pictured at the official inauguration.

We have also replaced two of our **swings** with **accessible** ones, seen in the picture above.

We are still awaiting the installation of our **accessible roundabout**, but in the meantime we have been busy with other improvement works (Left) Resolving the flooding issues under the circular swing and through the small gate to the playing field, adding soil, sowing grass seed, and allowing it to grow through the matting.



(Right) Another step closer in making our play area more inclusive. Our double gates are now locked with a radar padlock and have been re-hung for ease of opening, with wheelchair users especially in mind. Anyone who uses a Radar key **MUST** lock the gates behind them immediately so that the play area remains safe for all users, at all times. The padlock can be locked and unlocked from both sides, making this a very easy task. A big thank you to Martin Gadsby and his team from Move It who completed the work.



STOP PRESS: Our scooter racks have been installed, but our contractors are awaiting a license from York City Council for the installation of bike racks.

Farther ahead is the prospect, long delayed, of a basketball facility on the playing-field, which may come in the form of a **MUGA** (Multiple Use Games Area). If you have any thoughts on this project, **please share them with us using the contact details above.**

that produced an abundance of berries and brilliant autumn colour.

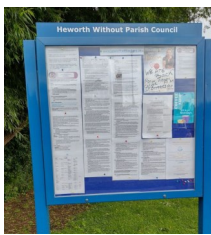


St Nicks Centre for Nature and Green Living are carrying

Community Speed Watch was started when a group of local residents became concerned about vehicles speeding in the area. They were trained in May 2021 and have been visiting police-approved locations in the parish approximately every two weeks at various times and days.
