Do you think more seating is needed in Heworth Without Parish? If so, you're not alone. In response to the last newsletter, some residents called

for benches to be installed around the parish using the budget awarded from City of York Council. In addition, over 75 residents have signed a petition requesting a bench be installed at the bus stop on Ashley Park Bridge. The petition comes in response to local concerns about the difficulties people who have restricted mobility or health issues may experience when standing to wait for buses. The Council has responded to this local demand and a bench will be installed soon. If you feel more public seating is required, please contact the Parish Council (see below) highlighting where you feel it would be most useful.
