
overgrowth and marking boundaries, so they're in ideal condition for prepping and planting.

Heworth Without Parish Council has been awarded a budget from City of York Council (due to a recent development in the area) to spend on improving facilities in the parish and we'd like your help in deciding how to spend it. The money must be used for outdoor play areas, amenity open space or sports pitches, so all ideas must fall within these areas, but otherwise anything will be considered.

A revised draft of the local development plan was released in July 2016, and went out for consultation when members of the public were invited to give feedback. The deadline for feedback was back in September 2016 and the plan is now back with City of York council for review and amendment. Heworth Without Parish Council recently awarded funding for some necessary drainage work at Hopgrove Playing Fields on Malton Road. Hopgrove Playing Fields are home to a number of

local sports teams, including Huntington Ladies FC (pictured), and the wet 2015 winter led to water-

logging and consequently, games having to be postponed. Aeration was carried out in

Older Citizens' Advocacy York (OCAY) is committed to supporting people over 50 in dealing with everyday issues that they might otherwise struggle with. People may need advocacy because they feel no one is listening to them, they don't know where to find the help they need or don't

agree with decisions that are being made about them. OCAY can help by helping people find the information they need to make decisions, tell them about their rights, provide support to write



letters and complete forms and challenge decisions. They provide this support free of charge through skilled volunteers and have helped people through a range of situations, such as managing disputes with utility companies, completing complex forms and organising care support.
